- 4. I enjoyed all the topics that spanned this committee, almost everything education-wise on this campus can be done through the Academic Affairs committee. In addition, I liked the open discussion during meetings that allowed us to share our experiences as students. (Maggie Sampson)
- 5. I enjoyed the accessibility of our Secretary if we ever needed anything. I liked our ability to talk about whatever our committee needed to talk about.
- 6. I enjoyed all of the academic reforms we did in this semester and shared my recent progress in biweekly meetings. (Zikang Fang)
- I enjoyed how flexible and open the committee was, for example being able to leave early to go to other committee meetings, as well as how discussion based our conversations have been while still being respectful. (John Day)
- B. What are some things you would like to see from this committee moving forward? Please be specific in explaining what you disliked about this committee this semester and if you would like to see certain things done differently.
 - Something I would like to see done differently moving forward with this committee would be to have more meetings. I feel like our meetings were very productive when we had them and that the discussions were sometimes cut short due to the amount of time we had. - 6. I hope we can meet virtually sometimes as well when we don't have too many things we need to discuss.(Zikang Fang)
- 7. I also agree that most of our meetings have been student concerns, and working on more initiatives could be an exciting endeavor for next semester (John Day)
- C. What is one goal you would like to set for yourself next semester regarding involvement in ASG and this committee specifically?
 - Unfortunately, I will not be able to participate in ASG and this committee next semester. I will be abroad in Luxembourg for the entire semester, and as such, will be resigning from my position. I will most likely be joining again when I return, however. (Mia Severance)
 - I would like to accomplish the initiatives that I ran on which included overdose education in UNV 101 classes and information on Narcan and other life-saving tactics in the case of an overdose. I have other initiatives that I will be working on in ASG in the Safety and Wellness committee that go with these initiatives such as drink covers for students and Narcan initiatives to prevent further overdoses and possible deaths on campus.  - 3. One goal that I have for myself is to find an inniative to work on, I do not have one at the moment but I really want to find something that will allow me to make a difference on campus! (Chelsie Kirk)
 - 4. Next semester, I would like to work towards an initiative possibly in On-Campus Affairs relating to concerts at Miami in Millett. For this committee, I'd like to do something with academic advisors and make sure they are providing the best possible services for students scheduling and more. (Maggie Sampson)
 - 5. I would personally like to help out a lot with the teacher awards since I have already helped out in the past.
 - 6. I really hope to find my own initiatives to promote in next semester since I find our current academic system overall is good. (Zikang Fang)
 - 7. Next semester I hope to start more initiatives now that I am more used to how ASG works, as well as helping out with the outstanding professor awards. (John Day)

- D. Name at least one thing you would like to work on in this committee next semester. *I am asking for a minimum of one idea/initiative, although you could have more! Don't worry about anything being fully developed. Even just an area of focus is fine!*
 - Something that I think should be worked on more next semester with this committee is the scheduling issues we discussed in our last meeting. Many students have issues with their scheduling and class choices, and I believe that this is something that needs to be from our group. Sadly I will not be able to contribute to this initiative, but I do believe this is important for us to do regardless. (Mia Severance)
 - 2. I will be working on legislation for overdose education in UNV 101 classes which I had previously discussed. Many students on campus aren't as exposed to party culture like there is at Miami and especially with the prevalence of Fentanyl recently things have gotten really dangerous. Most people have no idea what to do in the case of an overdose and have no idea what Narcan is. I firmly believe that this initiative can save lives and am passionate about making it apart of the freshman education program. (Abby Showalter)
 - 3. Something that I think we could work on is scheduling and the amount of seats that are open for each class. I think that we need to work on improving the overall scheduling experience for students especially because we are already stressed about so many other things, and I believe that we should not be stressed about scheduling.
 - 4. As mentioned above, I am interested in an initiative dealing with academic advisors and helping certain departments where students may struggle to get help from their advisors for scheduling and other issues.
 - 5. As I mentioned in the last answer, I would like to be a big contributor to the teacher awards next semester.
 - 6. I hope we can work on letting professors upload syllabus to the course list next semester as an initiative. Moreover, I would like to follow the ideas of McLaughlin to promote her initiatives.(Zikang Fang)
 - I would like to focus on helping out with the professor awards as well, but also possibly work on the scheduling concerns expressed above by Mia (John Day)
