# VII. Report A: Nav Chima, District 8 On-Campus Senator, Jakin Wu, Off-Campus Senator, and Nikhil Patel, Farmer School of Business Academic Senator

- a. \*\*\*TW: genocide/ethnic cleansing, suicide, SIV, police brutality, violence, mental health\*\*\*
- b. Senator Chima: we will be discussing what is happening in India & Myanmar and why that matters to ASG and Miami. Right now, there is a farmers' protest going on. The government passed legislation that would open up the agriculture to corporate forces, which will undermine many farmers' sources of income. Farmers have marched to the capital of India in November and have been camped out there since. Farmer suicides have increased exponentially. Over 250 million people have protested--this is the largest protest in human history. They want these bills completely repealed. Farmers make up 60% of India's population and is often a family business, which is why so many are willing to protest. The government has tried to intervene in the protests and suspended internet service in Delhi, where hundreds of thousands of farmers have been campedand has affected the protesters, their families, and other citizens. There has also been police byrutality, shutting off of water, and increased force. Because India supplies a lot of produce, this can affect these markets. India is also a democracy, and road blocks, water and food shortages and blocks can affect many other citizens.
- c. Senator Wu: this year, the military seized control of Myanmar and declared a year-long state of emergency due to suspicions of madd voter fraud. Mass protests over the coup have erupted all over the country, which have been met with police brutality involving water cannons, rubber bullets, and live amunition. The military has further began targeting the Muslim population. Over 700,000 Myanmar citizens have been displaced to Bangladesh. 130,000 Rohingya (Muslim citizens) have been confined to open air detention centers and other harmful conditions, including crimes including murder, rape, torture, sexual slavery, persecution, and enslavement
- d. Senator Patel: there are four main student impacts from this. International students from India or Myanmar could be directly affected over accessibility, financial issues, and violence. Many students also have family in India and Myanmar, which can affect mental health and personal worry, students at Miami should feel comfortable which includes mental health about issues abroad, and students who identify with these identities may feel for these communities, which will affect their mental health
- e. Senator Chima: as ASG, we need to discuss these issues and their impact, write and pass a sense of the senate out of support for thesestudents, and look into what Miami has been doing to advocate for those affected
- f. Parliamentarian Gates: what are some resources where we could learn about this?
- g. Senator Chima: I can send out independent journalists on the ground at the protests. BBC is also a good source
- h. Senator Wu: standard reputable news reports such as from the BBC and the UN
- i. Senator Payne: do you guys know of any charities or causes that we could make financial contributions to?
- j. Senator Chima: the Sikh Student Association has a short list of places to donate to that we could share. Khalsa Aid US specifically is a great organization
- k. Senator Patel: if you wanted to do some research into it and pursue it further, you can also attend Indian Student Association meetings regarding this and we can give you this information

- 1. Senator Thomas: what ideas do you guys have for supporting this on Miami's campus?
- m. Senator Chima: we're looking to hear back from you all as student leaders and to have a lot of mental health services available for students affected
- n. Senator McLaughlin: have you reached out to administration about this?
- o. Senator Chima: we wanted to present this to senate to get a feel for how other students feel about this issue
- p. Senator Kravitz: will this Sense take a stance on the actual politics of the issue?
- q. Senator Chima: no, it would be advocating for students that are being affected by these crises
- r. Senator Wu: we are still open to input, but when it comes to Myanmar, there aren't a lot of politics that involve the issue that includes genocide and ethnic cleansing
- s. Senator Patel: the farmers' protest in India is highly contested, but the object of a Sense is to show student support for international students and students at Miami who are being affected
- t. Senator Stein: do you know anything about the other side of the story?
- u. Senator Chima: in the case of the farmers, the other half would be those who want to become wealthier and increase industrial stakes by shifting towards more privatization. This also raises a lot of environmental issues
- v. Senstor Wu: due to the nature of the actions in Myanmar, i'm hesitant to give "another side" given that the UN has called it an explicit example of ethnic cleansing
- w. Senator Scott: as far as the agricultural issues happening in India, f it does come down to political opinions, it should come across as nonpartisan
- x. Senator Patel: we would ensure it is comprehensive to give all facts
- VIII. Old Business
  - IX. New Business Item A: Approval of Cycle II, Opportunity II Allocations
    - a. Secretary Waugh: we saw a lot of capital requests because orgs are still pretty limited of what events they can do. We pushed this back one week in hopes Miami changed their mass gathering events, but they did not. A lot of orgs used this opportunity to request capital funds seeing that in the future orgs can put on more events and not have to spend too much of their total. In total, we allocated over \$61,000 which puts us at \$128,000 for the semester and \$250,000 for the year. Ths is not anywhere where we would like to be, but I am happy to see that second semester requests appear to be up. I had initially budgeted much more in hopes that COVID restrictions could be eased by now
    - b. Senator Scott: if an organization still wants to request funds, is too late to do so?
    - c. Secretary Waugh: they have three opportunities to request funds. There is a third hearing on April 19th that are funds for the first 50 days of next semester and mega fair
    - d. Motion to approve allocations
    - e. Motion is seconded
    - f. Allocations are approved
  - X. New Business Item B: SB202122
    - a. Senator Elghazawi: this is a bill to move the duties of the Secretary of Alumni over to the vice president. We tried to be as clear and transparent about our thought process behind this. We are getting rid of the alumni committee, but this committee could be

reinstated as an ad hoc committee. If this passes, the committe for this year will continue to function and the committee would elect a new chair and the committee would be absorbed into the internal operating budget

- b. Senator Wu: there is some form of a student-led endowment fund. How would this be managed now that the committee would be abolished?
- c. Secretary Bosworth: this is not managed through ASG but through the Office of Advancement
- d. Senator Stack: what would this committee look like for the remainder of the school year?
- e. Senator Elghazawi: it wouldn't be a secretary necessarily but would be elected from the committee and would be following the bylaws as is
- f. Senator Stein: because the committee is already approved, the committee would be chaired by a current member, so it would be a senate-led committee for the rest of the year
- g. Senator Pallant: have you talked to past vice presidents for their input?
- h. Vice President von Zastrow: I did speak to our formers Vice Presidents and they see this as being a positive change
- i. Senator Kravitz: do you think this week is the best time to do this?
- j. Senator Elghazawi: passing this before a new vice president is what is important so we can properly acclimate them
- k. Speaker Murphy: I encouraged the authors to bring it to the floor this week. If senate votes to keep the position, it would be irresponsible to keep the position vacant longer
- 1. Vice President von Zastrow: this is a unique opportunity for the vice president and the vice president elect to define what this role will look like going forward, especially as i am working on transition documents
- m. Senator Stein: this position hasn;t been around that long, so it makes sense to make changes right now
- n. Senator Stack: I'm in support of this. It does a lot of good. It takes two positions that would fit together nicely
- o. Senator Jett: I support this as it gives needed structure to the VP role. We've been talking about getting rid of the alumni role for a while and it seems logical
- p. Senator Barnes: the position was created with great intent, but the role had too many restrictions that made this role less prevalent and needed, so I'm in support of this.
- q. Parliamentarian Gates: on the parliamentarian side, this is really well covered and is balanced out correctly. On the student senate side, a lot of what can be co,pleted in this position can be done in ad hoc form
- r. Senator Stein: in a pre-covid environment, the secretary has done things in person
- s. Senator Kravitz: I agree with the elimination of the position. I would like the express recommendation of the vice president-elect. Despite that, I would be in support of eliminating it right now
- t. Senator Elghazawi: this change is being made because our goal is to serve the student body, and at its heart, this isn't a role that directly serves the student body nor can it be rewritten to serve the student body
- u. Senator Chima: because this is my first year in ASG, I would love to hear more from people who are more familiar with this role
- v. Secretary Petrella: each secretary gives their own mark to the position, but when it comes to the cabinet, it's important to understand the value it adds to ASG and to

the student body. I have seen three different secretaries and have been unimpressed with all three

- w. Secretary Bosworth: as a former senator, there were a lot of good ideas but nothing that needs to be a paid position, especially considering that this can function easily as an ad hoc committee. This is not a position that needs over \$3,000 to be paid towards it. If you knew that your student fee dollars went towards a position that doesn't need to be paid, how would you feel?
- x. Secretary Small: past secretaries haven't been as successful, but this could be a failure on the senate for not picking the most qualified candidate to do so. When we talk about alumni, it's not a monolith. I still support this legislation and that this can be accomplished by the vice president
- y. Senator Jett: there is more potential for this role in a professional development role.
- z. Senator Kravitz: we shouldn't base our decision off of sticker price, but i stil think it's necessary
- aa. Senator Barnes: were any virtual events planned?
- bb. Senator Stein: there were not any events scheduled this past semester or this semester, but there isn't reason why there shouldnt have been
- cc. Parliamentarian Gates: if we are going to keep this position, we need to radically overhaul the way we do things. The responsibilities of this position work well with the VP position
- dd. Senator Sassan: when we were in person, former Secretary Koenig put on the hockey event, and it was one of the sole alumni events and it was exciting. Everyone was very encouraging. However, the VP has a lot more resources and support to leverage this into more than we have seen both in person and online
- ee. Senator Davies: the secretary position had a lot of potential, and this process gives us an opportunity to see how we can best serve the student body with that role
- ff. Senator Chima: I am in support of this legislation
- gg. Senator Wu: there is another organization that handles student alumni relationships, and they were not aware that there was an alumni position, which speaks to a failure of the position
- hh. Secretary Small: do you think this is a failure of ASG as a whole or the secretary position?
- ii. Senator Wu: I think it's a failure on both sides. I think at its core, there's a redundancy to the position
- jj. Senator Elghazawi: when we wrote this bill, we discussed reform. We found that there wasnt a good way to reform it and that moving the duties over to the VP is a type of reform
- kk. Motion to end debate and call to question
- ll. Motion is seconded
- mm. Legislation passes
- XI. New Business Item C: SB202123
  - a. Senator Elghazawi: this is a minor change but one that I was approached about by Chief of Staff Moreton and Secretary Chunias. Becauseof this bylaw, the Chief of Staff had to work with the Secretary for Communications to implement the student success fund. Chief of Staff Moreton and SecretaryChunias are both in full support
  - b. Senator Stack: what caused the change in the position?
  - c. Senator Elghazawi: because the secretary of communications mostly does website stuff would be my most reasonable guess

- d. Senator Kravitz: I'm in full support of this change. It's just a consistency change in the bylaws Senator Davies: this legislation just clarifies who should be in charge of this responsibility and is pretty straightforward
- e. Senator Sassan: I support this legislation
- f. Motion to approve by unanimous consent

  - a. Senator Pallant: this is legislation to update the bylaws to reflect the creation of a dining hall committee

  - d. Senator Payne: I'm in full support of this especially since it's just a continuation of the resolution we passed last semester

- Wellness Days
  - Sec. Petrella- Wellness guide will be completed tonight so keep an eye on the Slack channel.
- Health Care Guide
  - Sec. Petrella- The health care guides are translated! Check our shared drive in the international student transition folder to see them!
- Student Dining Hall Advisory Committee
  - Sec. Petrella- First meeting this past Friday went really well. Assuming next year is normal, they're going to be operating under normal conditions (every place will be open) and more food options will be available at various locations. Miami Grind (coffee) will be offered at various grocery stores in area.
- Vaccines
