VII. Reports

a. Effie Fraley, *Secretary for On-Campus Affairs*

10:40 PM Fraley: Semesterly report for ONC. I will keep it brief. Most of these you're aware of. Bullet-point updates but I can go more. Here is a list of committee members. I find people don't know how to access so these are resources. Addressing the past, I itemized out all the ONC concerns in an excel to mark which have been completed. If something was reported back but requires more, there's an option for that. It's like DAR, IP and Y for inprogress and yes. Vast majority done but some need to be worked out. You can see all the ONC concerns. I put a bulleted list of non-dedicated concerns: Swipe Donation – we had 9276 swipes sent to SSC and about 1300 have already been reallocated; Satellite Gym hours, I recommend going to those and talking to Farag. We need at least 10 people per hour to ensure that it will continue and is successful. We've been working a lot with RHA and I asked during const outreach how CLT and RHA correlate. I wanna ask what you know?

10:40 PM Grabow: CLT Pres sits on RHA

10:40 PM Fraley: Presidents will be points of contact for halls and are in charge of CLT. We worked on ID cost, as well as room accommodations for breaks. We are currently working on printer reconfig with steve harbin on where to put these extra printing locations ,maybe in dining halls whether or not theyd be as sanitary or after 8 pm. Markets were looked at as options. Went nowhere because markets don't have lots of space; and its not equitable based on geography. We started looking at academic facilities or markets where it makes sense for them to be spatially. Why doesn't Harrison have printing like FSB; we've been working with RHA but it is being reassigned. Constituent Outreach: we separated on-campus and district managers. As it gets further along you'll hear about dates. We talk a lot about low awareness and it helps if you all are there and are able to talk about what we do. Theres so many people who don't know about menstrual hygiene but are amazed to hear. Working on streamlining dining concerns with brian woodruff. Health hazards (spores/contamination) immediately directed to staff at the dining hall. If you notice what if someone else doesn't that needs to be immediately directed. We will be working on a campaign on that. Food inclusivity is something we're working on: gluten, vegan, vegetarian, as well as people who have celiac or other gluten problems. RA compensation and RA and Commuter meal plans. Ramadan accommodations with DNI spearheaded by Elghazawi to talk about fast and times and what to break fast with. We might not get a dining hall to stay open but what if *we* all trained and helped with that. It will aid transmission of information about dining halls. I know not a lot are excited about working in dining halls. Flag representation needs to be worked with katie Wilson. Collaborating with Julia and Shelby for the tampon initiative. For the future if you wanna hear the funniest story talk to singleton about saferide story. WE're gonna be working on that for a little bit. We have several that grew out of past concerns. Something about zebras in a van? We're continuing to work on strengthening CLT-RD-ONC relationship. You should work with them regularly. Lighting Audit still a go. Ardent Armstrong still going on. Resident Town Halls planned with ORL. Voice concerns direct to admin. Safe medication disposal, waiting on MUPD on how to go about this. Census planning; still waiting on uni. Compost reform; still waiting on Geno. Those are my songs of the week.

10:40 PM Bosworth: So this is SR192015 (long name) 2 weeks ago Lui presented this to us all about ediplomas with a lot of background and etc in email from Siegel. Big thing going around is academic fraud being counterfeited online. In convo with the registrar, she said that # of occasions of academic fraud increasing from once a year to once a month. It is increasingly difficult to distinguish fake certifications. Ediplomas give a new standard to issue ediplomas. I know lot of you wonder what you get at graduation? As it stands you don't get a real one but you get a case with instructions. Benefits of ediploma: display on linkedIN with instant verification for employers. We have seen that dozens of schools (UC) doing this. Sec Lui sent responses from registrar with your questions. If you wish to purchase a ceremonial paper diploma it is 4.70\$ to do so. Cost as stands for now is 10\$ of the matriculation fee. With ediploma it'd be 3\$ out of fee with optional 4.70. Yield to Lui

10:40 PM Lui: Thanks dan. I also know that there are concerns about extra fees. If there are any concerns I prefer you reach out to me or mandy than talking about it in the office, I don't think it fosters healthy working environment. I asked mandy and she said it'd be cheaper in long run, and if they took the fee it would just bounce down to us. Right now it is opt-in but if we push the charge onto the school it'll just get sent out to all of us anyways. They're not gonna cover selective diplomas because of fairness. When you consider this bill, consider whether or not the bill should be pushed on us all. Mandy said "I think the question should be asked if a paper one without verification or a verifiable ediploma should be the choice."

10:40 PM Bosworth: The 4.70 does not go to Miami, it goes straight to the diploma company(paradigm) to receive a paper copy of the diploma. Miami has very little control over the fee itself, but if we wanna eliminate it, it'll just get pushed out to everyone. With that, I open the floor.

10:40 PM Elghazawi. Does the 4.70 include tax and shipping?

10:40 PM Bosworth: 3:35 for diploma 1:45 for shipping?

10:40 PM Waugh: Currently do students pay for the paper diploma?

10:40 PM Bosworth: Yes, in matric fee.

10:40 PM Waugh: What is that?

10:40 PM Bosworth: It is an equal payment made over all terms at Miami that covers orientation costs. For some cohorts you paid it all upfront. AlcoholEDU, sex assault module, diversity modules, grad fees.

10:40 PM Singleton: The current system, the ediploma is cheaper?

10:40 PM Bosworth: you'll pay the same but the difference will, because of Miami tuition promise, won't change, but that 6.70 would be used for other matriculation purposes.

10:40 PM Lui: They're considering giving a medallion at graduation with extra fee.

10:40 PM Bosworth: It's 3.30 of the mat fee for the diploma. It is 4.70 to request paper. Currently it is 10.00 to request it through mat fee. The resources will benefit students.

10:40 PM Hankins: We move into debate

10:40 PM Finfrock: At this time I would like to add an amendment, shared with Hankins.

10:40 PM Hankins: Just dropped it in the slack. There's a motion to consider amend, do I hear a second?

10:40 PM Hankins: Motion carries to consider the amendment.

10:40 PM Finfrock: I respect all their work. Lui done exceptionally. However when I brought these up that it doesn't matter how we vote but the registrar will do it. Think about what that means. The University office will ignore us if we disagree. That's a dangerous message. Lui wrote "Inaction will do nothing." I understand that it doesn't matter how I vote, and that's why I'm putting this amendment forwards. As dan said, the mat fee doesn't change for us. If you want it, you gotta pay 5 bucks after you've already paid nickel and dime. I understand it doesn't seem like a big deal but we're told the uni cant afford. Greg got a 75k bonus last year. How cant we afford this? I yield

10:40 PM Doepke: As I understand, this fee isn't a Miami fee. It is a company fee that the diploma comes from. It's a service fee. It covers printing and shipping and stuff. It's not a fee Miami has control over. That's my issue with including the amend. I understand the want for Miami to cover the fee, but at the same time, they're already providing a diploma that is arguably, not arguably, worth more than a paper diploma because it actively validates your Miami credentials. They're providing something more important to have, and cause the paper diploma is low key something you just hang up on your wall. That's something people like to do, but at the same time having ot pay a service fee for that shouldn't be on the university to cover that since its just wall décor.

10:40 PM Farag: That's what I was gonna say. It's not really in the scope of the uni for them to pay, what's four dollars after thousands of thousands?

10:40 PM Finfrock: I respond because I can't understand why the uni can't afford this.

10:40 PM Bosworth: to allude to things said. The 4.70 is less than a chipotle burrito. I don't want anyone to think that we're insensitive to those who can't pay. Lui and I are working with SSC to get this afforded for those who cannot pay. As Doepke said, this isn't our realm or a Miami realm. With the matric fee, within it will stay the same, but potentially that will reduce. Would you rather it be 10\$ for diploma, or 3.70 for diploma and 7.30 for others programmes, maybe for intl students that are insufficient? We can use extra funds to improve things that need improvement. Finfrock alluded that the UNI will do what they want but as Siegel said, we must respect the power of the authoritarians in the admin, and this amendment could push us back further with the registrar or other officials in the uni. We don't want to...anger the admin over this. Finfrock has had bad encounters with admin, and I hope we can use this as an opportunity to work with them equally. By giving this to SSC, look at the swipe donations and think about what we can do. If you wanted to contact mandy or lui about this, it's been 3 weeks. You could've asked this well in advance, but having an amendment here today defeats the whole bill and won't get anything done.

10:40 PM Hankins: We will treat everyone with respect in this chamber, and I am closing the speakers list.

10:40 PM McKeon: The value of this bill is in the security. As a transfer, I have experience with this and it's all a racket. I think the value of not being able to forge the Miami education is valuable.

10:40 PM Jett: I think it important to find a compromise. The SSC that Bosworth brought up really convinces me not to vote on this amendment because I believe that to be a good compromise to get those dollars to those who need it. I don't think we need this.

10:40 PM Grabow: I think theres two things. The bill itself and the money, and the philosophy of catering to admin. Should we pity their finance? I will never defend the uni over the student, and I think the student should always win. As Bosworth demonstrated, we're going to pay the same no matter what, so I prefer we get more benefits than less.

10:40 PM Elghazawi: It improves security concerns, and I think that is something that helps. As Grabow said, we should pick and choose our battles, and I don't think this battle is the right one. I think it is better saved for something else.

10:40 PM Bosworth: Echo Elghazawi about security. Students must consider security, and I ask should a fake diploma let you get a job over a real diploma? My mother works at HR and she sees this a lot, and as students, we can make a change to make a 10-15-20 year change where a Miami U degree is worth it and you can know it is worth it.

10:40 PM Petrella: Same stuff: I was in support of the amendment, and it did not pass. There are times, and I agree with Finfrock, that there are times in ASG where we will have things presented that though we may not agree, we consider that our constituentencies would be agree? Maybe going to SSC is best option. As with ElGhazawi, We must pick battles.

10:40 PM Elghazawi. Just to touch on it again. Finfrock point is important, students shouldn't have to pay for what they needn't. This isn't a battle we need to fight. If you have financial troubles and you need help, SSC will provided it (shrugs). For most, 4.70 isn't the biggest issue. As Doepke said, as this is wall décor, picking a fight over 4.70 will amount to anything.

HANKINS: WHY WE'RE MEETING TODAY

Hankins: Victoria told me yesterday that she'd be out for 7 days in isolation. She was concerned that no one would be able to lead the committee today and that there would be no women in the room. We need to decide whether this testimony should continue. Speaker Siegel will be at the testimony at 6; ex officio member. Enough at stake for the witness that we needed to do this meeting on such short notice. Anybody on the investigation is able to be a temporary chair.

Tinsley: I think it should be Omar or Cole because Cole has the most experience and Omar has been here since the beginning.

Elghazawi: I think it should be someone who's been here since the beginning.

Tyree: I think Omar's good for the position. I think Cole or Omar.

Farag: I think Cole or Omar. I think it makes a lot of sense for the parliamentarian to do it.

Hankins: Omar has a better handle on the investigation and evidence than I do. If a voting member becomes acting chair. When should the chair be able to step down and cast a vote. There's no reason as to why you couldn't.

Cole nominated. Omar nominated. 3-1 vote for Omar. Sen. Elghazawi is elected temporary chair of the Oversight Committee until Speaker Pro Tempore Villanueva's return.

Elghazawi: Past [redacted]'s testimony, I don't think any further actions in the investigation need to be taken. If Sarah sits in the meeting tonight and [redacted], I don't see an issue with that.

Tinsley: We should definitely bring in [redacted] today. Very courageous of her to do that. We should respect her courage. We should stick to Bylaw-based questions for [redacted]'s testimony.

Elghazawi: Are we asking [redacted] questions about conversations she's had with the investigated member since they were elected? We should not ask her any questions about [redacted]'s testimony, since she is sitting in.

Committee agrees.

Elghazawi: We'll move forward with both testimonies scheduled for Wednesday and Thursday. A quorum should be present when needed.

III. D&I Roundtable Discussion

A. Remembering Freedom Summer

1. Kamara: I am creating a class to help remember Freedom Summer and I would appreciate all your help in doing so. This class has been planned before through Jackie Johnson who works in the library. The first email you got is the planned tour, the second email is the syllabus for the class. Dr. Scott wanted to partner on the tour with the class. He wants us to create a model; see how long it's going to be, why we're doing this, etc. We need a timeline of where we're going. This is going to be a week-long course either during j-term or during spring break. How do you want students to learn? I'm leaning towards interactive.
 - a) 1. Educational plan
 - b) 2. See if we can include alumni in those cities
 - c) 3. Cost
2. Devedjian: makes sense to make this a j-term course. When I went to Oman most of it was interacting with the culture. We could model it off of that. When you go to these places, interacting with the people there, the places, etc.
3. Finfrock: a lot of what we did in Washington was actually going to the places themselves and meeting with someone, had to have questions prepared. You had to research people and their work, and ask questions. That might be a good way of modeling it to.
4. Kamara: I did similar in San Francisco and I think that would be a good model. When is the Civil Rights conference itself?
5. Devedjian: two to six predeparture modules to help people prepare themselves.
6. Small: I've never been on a study abroad program, is there an instructor?
7. Kamara: Yes, and Dr. Scott recommended Jackie Johnson. Also the director of CSDI at regionals. We want to make this equal opportunity for all campuses.
8. Grabow: What are they looking for specifically?
9. Kamara: the sky is the limit, but it has to fall within freedom summer. We could start here or we could start in Mississippi. We should visit other places on the way down to Mississippi.



10. Sarfino: how will this work in terms of funding?
11. Kamara: we can pull from different departments. Western Program would be a great place to start. Giving students scholarships is a great way to start.
12. Sarfino: what extent of the fee are the students going to have to pay?
13. Kamara: that's what we're gonna have to figure out.
14. Parker: looking at the flyer for it, it says the trip itself is \$4000. Will that be part of your tuition.
15. Small: there's a lot of logistical stuff going on
16. Kamara: What we have to look at stuff is the main details
17. Small: I have a lot of logistical questions too but we have to talk to Johnson or Benice first and these are questions we are not going to be able to answer as students. The help of admin would be useful.
18. Kamara: what is our route right now is what we are figuring out?
19. Finfrock: taking a bunch of stops along the way
20. Kamara: there are a bunch of landmarks we can stop at
21. Parker: personal experience, I've basically done this trip with my family. There's a lot of museums and stuff in Atlanta is just as rich as in Alabama if we want to look at that.
22. Small: is this meant to be about freedom summer specifically?
23. Kamara: it's a part of it, I'd like for it to be mostly freedom summer based though. It's a rich part of Miami's history
24. Finfrock: New Orleans could be a good part of it as well
25. Bracely: would it be like a bus trip
26. Kamara: another logistical thing
27. Grabow: could have a pre-class in Miami and then spend more time in the South so we could spend less time in transit
28. Small: what do you want from us today? What the course rhetoric should look like?
29. Kamara: figuring out the locations and how we're going there. The route essentially
30. Bracely: whatever location has the most stuff in it that's accessible. Alabama might be a really good place to start.
31. Parker: lots of stuff in Mississippi is on the east coast.
32. Kamara: most of the stuff should be in Alabama.



33. Grabow: would be more impactful to have both museums and historical sites
34. Finfrock: a way to connect it back to today is to stop in NO, a lot of stuff that happened in Katrina.

41. Kamara: we can make this a month-long, the issue is cost.

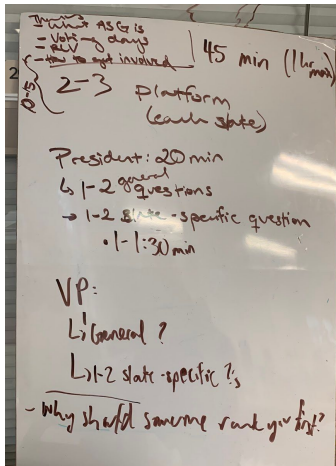
