- a. SR021536 – Resolution Reaffirming Support for the Creation of a Faculty Tardiness Rule
 - i. Passed something similar last year
 - ii. Changing to 20 minutes rather than 15
 - iii. Questions:
 - 1. Cary- what about professors putting a note on the door to cancel class?
 - a. The professor should email the students
 - 2. Fosina: how do we know that 15 minutes isn't enough? (2 follow ups)
 - a. Student responses

3. Have you talked to faculty about reasonable amounts of time?
 - a. Not sure what scheduling procedure would cause 20 minute tardiness
4. Did you look into reducing the amount of time?
 - a. 15 minutes wasn't enough- some classes are 3 hours long
5. Bowersox: what steps do you plan on taking to implement?
 - a. Deans are aware of the bill
6. Holaday: what if the professor still marks the student as absent?
 - a. Can reach out to department heads

iv. Debate:

1. DiGiacobbe: in favor of the 15 minute rule; makes a friendly amendment of changing 20 to 15
 - a. Not friendly
2. Vandervoort (Snyder): currently has a professor that has a knee issue that makes her 20-25 minutes late; but she allows the students to arrive late as well; possible exemptions for special circumstances
3. Lazarski: good job,
4. Oncken: clearly did research and put a lot of time into this; elderly or disabled professors should find an alternate means of transportation
5. Bowersox: support but want to make sure it will be followed through with
 - a. Cary: working on it

i. Lean Committee on Bike Sharing

1. Lean Committee Objectives

- a. Understand demand for a bike share program
- b. Recommend a program to meet demand, if warranted
- c. Promote program, if implemented

2. Lean Committee's Approach

- a. Give key campus and community members a seat at the table
- b. Evidence-based
 - i. Ex: results from the Transportation Survey will help support the committee's first 2 objectives
- c. Consensus based decision making

3. Transportation Survey Preliminary Data

a. Goals:

- i. Find out how students and employees get to and from campus
 - ii. Yield data necessary for carbon footprint calculation
 - iii. This year, also tried to gauge interest in a bike share program
- b. 1,633 respondents
- c. Undergrads: a little over 1/3 total
- d. 1/3 are likely or very likely to use a bike in their travels on campus
- e. Early Data on Bike Sharing Program Structure Preferences
 - i. Most would prefer a semester membership fee, but some would prefer a daily or hourly rate
 - ii. Most would use a bike share to get around campus
 - iii. Most would not participate if helmet use was required

4. Lean Committee Next Steps

- a. Waiting for final data from survey
 - b. Will use survey data, in combination with other
- ii. Questions:
- 1. Holaday: how would this be paid for?
 - a. Not sure yet what would be the most sustainable option

2. DiGiacobbe: has the committee looked into sidewalk congestion if more bikes are used?
 - a. This is a main focus of the committee- creating different pathways dedicated to bikes
3. Schwarzenbach: when would this happen?
 - a. Hopefully by next fall, but no set timeline
4. Holaday: liability?
 - a. Would possibly contract the program out to a company, so they would take care of the liability issues; students would also likely have to sign a waiver
5. Oncken: how many bikes to sustain a university of this size?
 - a. Right now, playing around with what it would look like with 40 bikes; still looking into a lot of this and waiting on the final data
6. Fosina: what would be the process for people who have their own bikes? What would stop people from taking a bike home from class?
 - a. There would be a certain time limit during the day for subscribers and they would have to pay more if you have it longer
7. Snyder: what if the rack is full and you have to go to class?
 - a. This is definitely an issue; working on it
8. Fleisher: can bikes be returned to any rack?
 - a. Yes
9. Is there any pilot program that will be taking place?

a. It is likely that a small-scale project will take place first
