 - a. Sen. Bosworth: Today we're considering approval of RBW for next academic year. RBW is the tier system for student orgs that gives them certain rewards. JS and seal ambassadors are here to talk about it. Spkr Siegel sent them out and they haven't changed since last year.
 - b. JS: Hi I'm the architect of a lot of the systems here. Caroline and I made Red brick Rewards together. We brought student orgs together to see what they wanted. We are here to talk about a possible future change. Some requirements are annual. So if an organization has bad leadership one year and they don't submit anything, they will be ruined. We worked with several orgs on this. We want to talk to students and see what we should do down the road
 - c. Parliamentarian Hankins: what was the origin of RBR?
 - d. JS: the program itself is overseen by student activities. ASG funding is tied to it. We gave ASG a few years to make the decisions of what should be required from orgs and what rewards should be. After this year, there will be 1 more year of it being on ASG, and then we will re-discuss it
 - e. Parliamentarian Hankins: did you initially believe that students should approve the requirements?
 - f. JS: senate has a say in approving the requirements
 - g. Parliamentarian Hankins: why should the senate approval expire after 3 years?
 - h. JS: you are the voice of student orgs still
 - i. Senator Sarfino: when do you complete annual requirements?
 - j. JS: you complete it at any point throughout the year
 - k. Senator Sarfino: what is the span of our power to remove requirements?



- B. President Crawford and Dr. Crawford met the candidates and took a picture with them.
- C. Siegel: Let's have the candidates introduce themselves.
 - 1. Candidates Jannie Kamara (P) and Jessica Von Zastrow (VP)
 - 2. Candidates Cameron Hunter (P) and Keresa Murray (VP)
 - a) Hunter joined later in the meeting due to a pre-disclosed conflict approved by the Committee.
 - 3. Candidates Jacob Kramer (P) and Nadia Elayan (VP)

II. Election Timeline

A. Siegel: Let's start by discussing the timeline. RHA is hosting a forum for all of the candidates on March 2. Meet the Candidates Night and the Debate is scheduled for March 12 in Shideler 152. Election days are March 17th and March 18th 7:00 A.M. - 7:00 P.M. The 17th is Primary Day in Ohio and we will be coordinating with groups getting out the vote on that day.

III. Election Rules and Guidelines

- A. Siegel: Each candidate has a copy of the rules. Just wanted to go over some highlights. Timeline is muddied by petition deadline being extended. Campaigning officially begins at the conclusion at this meeting.
- B. Siegel: The more creative you all are, the better this election will be. Ask questions. Don't break University rules, but you can push the boundaries of what

- is written. We'd be happy to clarify questions. Ask building managers in residence halls about putting up flyers.
- C. Siegel: ASG will not endorse any candidate. We will provide equal resources to all candidates.
- D. Siegel: If you break a rule and it's accidental, you get a warning. From there, violations escalate to Level I (24 hours), Level II (48 hours), and Level III (disqualification). Do not be late with weekly report because that is a Level I violation. Timeline is important so Elections Committee can produce a report by Monday and send to The Miami Student, ASG, etc.
 - 1. Von Zastrow: Is there a time frame for us to submit the expense report?
 - Siegel: Not too far out from deadline because it is an expense report. I will try my best to remind you in advance of each deadline.
- E. Siegel: If you disagree with a decision of the committee in regards to a violation, you can appeal to the Judicial Council.
- F. Sassan: There will be a section on that weekly report for information to be included in ASG brochures, social media promotion, etc. Not every week, but some weeks.
- G. Siegel: Moving to expenses. The cap on spending for the whole election is \$250. You can fundraise. We don't want people expending exorbitant amounts of money. There are creative and effective ways to reach people at low or no cost. An expense report lists out everything you spent money on -- a list of items, how much you spent on them, and receipts. If people are donating goods to you, that counts towards your spending cap. Don't be late on expense reports. Don't hide anything from the Elections Committee -- that would be a pretty significant ban. If a student organization is donating to you, make sure it is from their agency account. Affiliated organizations cannot give you any money from their school accounts.
- H. Siegel: Campaign materials and procedures. Any item that you're using will be counted in your expense report and be considered your campaign material. Anyone campaigning for you is a staff member and you are responsible for your supporters. You're responsible for removal of campaign material at the conclusion of the General Election.
- I. Siegel: We've moved away from General Election plus a Runoff Election. We now use Ranked Choice Voting. Each voter must rank all three slates before voting. On our end, we're capturing the preference of voters so that, if one candidate does not get a majority on the first ballot, we reallocate the second votes of the last-place candidate to the remaining two candidates. I will share an explanation with you to share with voters. You will do the most to inform voters about the change.
- J. Siegel: Appendix A explains institutional resources. ASG is giving you resources to make your lives easier and make campaigning easier. We'll provide: tabling reservations, digital half-screen advertisements, physical banner space

reservation in Armstrong. That will be for week leading up to Election Day. Sec. Sassan will take headshots of you if you want.

- 1. Sec. Sassan: I'm not great at headshots.
- K. Siegel: Slates will be promoted on social media by ASG in an equal manner.
 - 1. Sec. Sassan: I will place information on the website in a fair way based on what you provide. Website updates should be done by March 1, which is when that information is due to me.
- L. Siegel: I shared the weekly report form with you just now. You can see each part.
 - 1. Von Zastrow: Do you want an itemized list written out?
 - a) Siegel: Yes.
 - 2. Sassan: Form should work with images, but if it malfunctions you can email images to me. If I leave anything out, shoot me an email.
 - 3. Siegel: I'm open to a better system.
- M. Siegel: If you want to table in ASC, rank the days and times you prefer. We'll equally spread out time for all campaigns. We'll figure out equal apportionment during Election Week. If another student organization wants to support you with a table, that is fine too. There is a link here to the guidelines for Armstrong Student Center for screens and banners -- you're responsible for meeting those. The bulk of this information is due on Sunday.
 - 1. Elayan: Do you only need one of us to submit each week?
 - a) Siegel: Yes. Don't double send.
- IV. Communication/Candidate Liaisons
 - A. Siegel: We've assigned a liaison for each candidate and the committee. Sen. Elghazawi is with Hunter-Murray. Sen. Giang is with Kamara-Von Zastrow; Speaker Pro Tempore Villanueva is with Kramer-Elayan. We'll communicate with the committee, with your liaisons, and with me through GroupMe.
 - 1. Sen. Elghazawi: GroupMe is down.
 - 2. Speaker Siegel: Putting a pause on GroupMe for now.
- V. Any questions or concerns?
 - A. Kamara: Are we allowed to use free resources on campus?
 - 1. Siegel: Yes. If accessible to anyone, you can use it.
 - B. Kamara: If members of Miami who we don't know do things on their own accord for us, does that still fall on us?
 - 1. Siegel: No. If they are making a sheet sign for you, they are probably on your campaign.
 - C. Kramer: Do items need cost estimates?
 - 1. Siegel: Yes. Just look up estimates online.
 - D. Murray: What does a donation look like exactly?
 - 1. Siegel: If someone gives you t-shirts or a banner, that needs to be deducted.
 - E. Von Zastrow: What about sticks of chalk or markers? Do we need to mark those?

- 1. Siegel: We don't need to be that technical. If you buy chalk at Wal-Mart, expense the purchase. Don't kill yourself over totally itemizing everything.
- F. Kamara: How do you claim trees?
 - 1. Siegel: I don't know.
- G. [Candidate Cameron Hunter joins the meeting after an exam and introduces himself. The other candidates introduce themselves to Hunter.]
 - 1. Siegel: I'll touch base with Hunter after.
- H. Siegel: You're people first and students second. This can come third. This will be stressful, but take care of yourselves. The Elections Committee is here to help. You can officially start campaigning now. I will send an email with the forms we discussed today. I'll create the GroupMe.
 - 1. Murray: How soon will you know times for events?
 - a) Siegel: I'll let you know ASAP.
 - b) Murray: What's the end time for debates?
 - (1) Siegel: Let's say 8:00 P.M. is the hard max. The time is still flexible.
 - 2. Elayan: Will we have a meeting before the debate?
 - a) Siegel: Yes. We'll communicate the plan in advance.
- I. Perkins: Congratulations. This is a really great opportunity. If you have questions, let me know. I'm a resource as well. Be genuine, be honest, and have fun. Keep your sanity -- that's the most important part. We'll all a good support system. Lean on us if you have any questions or concerns.
