II. Administration Updates/Concerns

- A. Kathy: All operations will now be run through Aramark, so contact them for anything!
- B. Brian: Scott would normally be here as well!
- C. Jonathan: There's been a lot of behind the scenes change since May. Our primary change was Armstrong. We wanted to listen to feedback. We implemented Grubhub and have dealt with some kinks, like with anything new. We then moved into the Commons. We also have concessions with the first home football game. We've also changed up the way food is being prepared, and we're working with Joanna to include nutrition. We're making good progress but we have to keep working. Hiring has always been an issue, but we're still working. I've been putting some stuff on my social media accounts, and we have some people through that. We all come from different universities, so we're taking things we did there and use them to build ideas. It's going to be an exciting year! There has been a huge issue Gluten/Celiac need on this campus. We're hitting that very hard.
- D. Amanda: We're still trying to merge the two teams together, which is a change for everybody. We had a great management meeting yesterday. Lots of folks are coming down to support culinary wise.

- E. Jules: Question, what does marketing really mean in the perspective of students?1. Christian: Social media, signage for the commons across campus.
- F. Brian: The Haines location is open now! Sumeshi moved as well. What's the plan for where Sumeshi has been?
 - 1. Amanda: Field to fork! It's a play off of Dividends.
 - 2. Brian: Withrow Starbucks still not open. But the goal is, it's not an equipment problem but a staffing issue?
 - 3. Amanda: Working on windows and floors. We have an ample amount of students, just working on training.
 - 4. Grace: Is there a targeted date?
 - a) Amanda: Not quite yet. Maybe after fall break, but that's a huge maybe.
 - 5. Jonathan: One of the biggest hiccups was equipment. Now that we're getting in there, we're getting there. There's a huge need to get that open.
- G. Joanna: There was some concern about allergens. We're continuing to be nut friendly. There is a different type of allergen icon. New platform.
 - 1. Jonathan: I need to gauge Kosher dining on campus, and we had awareness of what dishes contain pork. A lot of people don't eat pork and we need to have it added sooner rather than later.
- H. Christian: With the feedback, some locations have a QR code on the tables, and it's a quick survey about quality of food. It helps us a lot! We need both the good and the bad.
- I. Kathy: In addition to the QR codes on the tables, the university is involved in an organization called NACUFS, and every year we do a very large survey for food quality, we could use ASG support to get that broadcast. It's the same question at every campus, so we can benchmark against other campuses. These things all lead back to admissions. We need as much feedback as possible. There are three questions on the survey we could specify to Miami, and they're all fill in. One of the questions is if you live off campus what would get you to purchase a meal plan. Another one is what would get you to work in dining, and most responses have to do with not wanting to deal with customers. The final question is about allergens and special diets. Anything you guys can do to get more responses would be great. There will be a unique code to the student.
- J. Kathy: We need support for the student body for the digital IDs and downloading the Grubhub app.
 - 1. Grace: Number for the digital IDs?
 - 2. Kathy: Not quite, but we have them from a few weeks ago. You can just tap the door, you don't have to pull it out.

- A. Jules: At some point I will like to bring up sustainability in the future, specifically composting. I was looking at the Aramark 2021 year in review thing. Specifically composting.
- B. Amanda: I just got off the phone with the EcoReps, and I have a lot of ideas about composting.
- C. Jules: Talking about your past, Miami is in the process of hiring a new Director of Sustainability. Should be announced soon.
- D. Amanda: In the future, we are bringing a sustainability manager.
- E. Jules: I think it would be great to maybe start with Shriver, then maybe move to a commons.
- F. Jonathan: It does really well to start small and get it done well. The bowls here are compostable, but they're no better than plastic without composting. We do have the means with purchasing, but we can give you an open fields source. Starbucks is fair trade, so that counts towards points. We can fill out the food part of it very easily. We can show you what initiatives we have, cage free eggs and local purchasing. The biggest piece is student awareness, because it means nothing. Students take a lot of food and then waste it. Do you guys have a food donation program?
- G. Jules: We have the meal swipe donation program. Not a lot of swipes get used. I don't use all my swipes.

- H. Brian: The issue has always been that students haven't had much of a need, not that we haven't had too many! One of the biggest things is do students know?
- I. Kathy: Also identifying who the students are with the food insecurities.
- J. Jules: We may want to bring off-campus affairs into it.
- K. Brian: You all can reach out to the student success center.
- L. Amanda: We used to do a program where we would identify healthier options and then students would purchase them and then we would have a pantry.
- M. Kathy: We did that a few years ago.
- N. Brian: Students can't donate dining dollars, but that would be a great option. Those are great opportunities.
- O. Jules: Does this committee have a relationship with the Food Recovery Network?
- P. Brian: Are we talking about donating items or dining hall food?
- Q. Jules: Donating I think.
- R. Brian: I think that would be the Student Success Center. Craig Bennett and Ashley Hopkins are two great contacts.
- S. Jules: STAR report

- D. Amanda: Uniform, free meal per shift, \$14 an hour, and there are positions available for student managers. We want to make a student leadership program as well. Christian is looking for marketing interns. HR, finance, some functional groups.
- E. Grace: We could email individual colleges as well.
- F. Jonathan: It's very flexible as well. I work with a lot of computers, and I would much rather our folks with talent focus on preparing food.
