IX. New Business Item A: Approval of Cycle 2, Opportunity 2 Student Organization Funding Allocations

- a. Secretary Waugh: Last night we had our second funding hearing of the semester, fourth of this year. We allocated \$132,709.69 out of \$181,000 requested. We still have a little under a million to give away due to the surplus.
- b. Secretary Morris: There has been confusion about asking for funding as a senator. Go to your secretary and we will figure it out. All we have to do is adjust the IOB.
- c. Senator Ryan: Women in Law asked for \$95. Do you remember why they were denied that funding?
- d. Secretary Waugh: They were not in a Red Brick Rewards tier.
- e. Senator Crone: What was the major reason a lot of funding wasn't allocated?
- f. Secretary Waugh: The biggest things are food and events not being on the Hub.
- g. Senator Payne: Some orgs got more money than they requested, why was this?
- h. Secretary Waugh: Sometimes an org will come in without one of the requirements checked despite the fact that it fulfills the requirement.
- i. Pro Temp Payne: What do you think ASG should do in the future to get more funds allocated for student orgs?

- j. Secretary Waugh: In my two years in this position there has been a leadership gap. I think we need more frequent communication and SEAL workshops. I think there are opportunities to engage individual student organizations. For now, if anyone is interested in my position come talk to me and if anyone has any ideas feel free to express them.
 - k. Senator Parker: NPHC is listed three times at different amounts?
 - l. Secretary Morris: They are comprised of several organizations, so they show up multiple times when they request.
 - m. Senator Ryan: Is there a list of reasons available online?
 - n. Secretary Morris: There is a list on our website, the Hub, and through ASG funding training.
 - o. Senator Giaquinto: Why are the numbers different?
 - p. Secretary Waugh: That is a mistake.
 - q. Senator Giquinto: How does the percentage of allocation compare to the past?
 - r. Secretary Waugh: It is about the same.
 - s. Senator Crone: I think every issue of potential error was resolved. I encourage the passing of these funding allocations.
 - t. Senator Scott: Thank you to everyone in finance!

- X. New Business Item B: SB212213: *A Bill to Update the Bylaws of the Secretary for On-Campus Affairs*
- a. Parliamentarian Elghazawi: This bill is updating the bylaws for the On-Campus Secretary. The bylaws are severely outdated and do not provide any specificity for the position. Secretary Pallant and I worked on this to give the position more guidance and clarity. We've added that the Secretary chairs the Dining Committee, working with senators on outreach events, and several offices that the secretary should keep in contact with.
 - b. Senator Crone: Are these changes set by precedent by Secretary Pallant or have many secretaries done this?
 - c. Secretary Pallant: None of these are new things, we've tried to change the bylaws for a couple years but it was too specific previously.
 - d. Senator Hughes: Is the On-Campus part referring to senators with On-Campus constituencies?
 - e. Secretary Pallant: That one refers to the district events we put on.
 - f. Senator Madrigal: Are these changes specific to the rule?
 - g. Parliamentarian Elghazawi: The Dining Hall Advisory Committee is the only thing relatively recent in terms of precedent.
 - h. Senator DeVictor: Is this for all on-campus senators including those not on the committee?
 - i. Parliamentarian Elghazawi: Yes.

- j. Senator Scott: Is any event taking place in my district something I'm obligated to be a part of?
- k. Parliamentarian Elghazawi: Not necessarily, these are outreach events.
- l. Senator Crone: I think the bill is good and it accurately portrays the duty of the On-Campus secretary.
- m. Senator Parker: For anyone with concerns, the bylaws can always be changed, so don't be worried about the longevity of the changes.
- n. Parliamentarian Elghazawi: If you ever wanna change bylaws, I'm your guy.

XI. New Business Item C: *SB212214: A Bill to Implement a Land Acknowledgement into Associated Student Government Practices*

- a. Parliamentarian Elghazawi: There are two aspects to this bill that will be changed: the bylaws and the constitution. To make changes to the constitution, two thirds of Senate must propose it. Once it is passed, the Miami Student will promote and there will be a referendum vote around the same time Senate elections occur.
- b. SBP Jett: Back in September, I met with Kara Strass from the Myaamia Center. Land acknowledgements without action can come off as performative, and using it too often can make it lose its meaning. The Myaamia Center encourages this at public meetings. ASG sets an example for other orgs, and the student body voting for an amendment is a great opportunity to engage students. The Myaamia Center is not allowed to sponsor legislation because of university reasons. Secretary Stephens and I are organizing an event for November 2022 as well.
- c. Senator Kelley: Will this be read before every Senate meeting?
- d. Parliamentarian Elghazawi: It would not be read before every meeting.
- e. Speaker Villanueva: I felt that it would lose meaning if I read it every meeting. I want it read at the first meeting and other important ASG events.
- f. Senator McLaughlin: Could you explain the referendum process?
- g. Parliamentarian Elghazawi: Per the constitution, changes must be proposed by the student body or by two-thirds of Senate. By voting on this bill we are proposing the amendment. It will then be published by us and the Miami Student and we are passing it now to give enough time. It would happen at the same time as senator Hub elections during the first week of May.
- h. Senator Hughes: What is the education or outreach that will occur?
- i. SBP Jett: We have some graphs, some Instagram posts, and if you have other ideas please let me know!
- j. Senator Giaquinto: After everyone that votes is gone, whose responsibility is it to continue education?

- k. Parliamentarian Elghazawi: Broadly it is all of ASG, but I am positive that future leaders will keep it up. It has been a focus of the DEI committee for several years.
- l. Secretary Stephens: This is something I'm working on with my committee. We are trying to expand action campus-wide. It will be very important that the next secretaries will be able to take on this role.
- m. Speaker Villanueva: When there are ongoing initiatives that mention specific people, it is implied that the responsibility is passed down.
- n. Senator Hughes: I think this is a good first step. I look forward to more action following this.
- o. Senator Constandinidis: I'm glad we worked with the Myaamia Center and took their comments under consideration. I think we should pass it.
- p. Senator Crone: A concern I have is that it puts a lot of trust into future speakers. I'm worried that if it is not required that it will get swept under the rug.
- q. Secretary Stephens: I understand the sentiment, but it will be on the next leadership to ensure collaboration to ensure that does not happen. The work we are accomplishing right now is timely. These acknowledgements are a way to ensure that the erasure of the removal of indigenous peoples is not forgotten. ASG needs to set an example and we would like to see this acknowledgement read at every public gathering.
- r. Senator Madrigal: I don't see the enforcement of ASG spreading awareness.
- s. Speaker Villanueva: This is the standard language of legislation, and we also have channels like the Miami Student to hold us accountable.
- t. Senator DeVictor: Feel free to write legislation to put stricter rules.
- u. Senator Hughes: I would urge you to do continual work to prevent this from happening and to motivate future action.
- v. Senator Patel: If someone wants to propose an amendment change, I think it should not be a mandated thing. There is a fine line between performative.
- w. Senator Orlando: I am in vehement support, but I think an amendment would be a departure from what the constitution typically is.
- x. VP McKeon: You are voting on this bill to send it to the student body. If you have concerns about it, I would've hoped you would've looked at it before you came to Senate.
- y. SBP Jett: One example of how we can ensure this is implemented is that we will be taking actions
- z. Secretary Stephens: Tonight we want to set a precedent in the right example. I think this debate is contrary to what we're here to do tonight.
- aa. Parliamentarian Elghazawi: In my perspective, the constitution establishes our mission and it is important to acknowledge why we are where we are.

II. Check/Icebreaker

- A. Please discuss one area concerning DEI that you have seen Miami University improve in?

Sen. Bakshi - Within classes, Professors actively taking the time to talk about some DEI Movements on campus and in classes – redefining “sex” and even options in the dining hall

Sen. Ogunnowo - The new dining hall options for gluten-free and other restrictions, humanities department newsletters

Sen. Dang - appreciating how much diversity and culture that we actually have on campus

Director Gates - a larger commitment to language change. Ex: the move away from the term “feminine hygiene products” to more inclusive wording, especially recently w/ the legislation regarding menstrual products and the use of the phrase “menstrual products” and even with the point of looking into putting them in men's bathrooms also. Just bigger conversations on queer inclusion are being more mainstream.

Sec. Stephens - The use of language also and faculty representation who actively represent and specialize in the topics has been something change in the past semesters.

III. Updates From the Chair

A. GNB Audit

1. Met with I&S to discuss financialization for GNB Plans
 - a. Met with I&S a few days ago.
2. The necessary information will be incorporated into interactive maps
 - a. The idea of gender-neutral bathrooms being on main Miami maps will be put in process
3. Plan to meet with LGBTQIA+ Director for legislation sponsorship/compare notes on the work we are doing
 - a. Partnering with the CSDI and applying pressure to faculty. Dr April focused on institutional things. Focusing on correct amenities and pushing that information out.
4. ASG Legislation is currently being worked on and we would like to see this sent to the senate floor no later than Tuesday April 5th.

Sec Stephens: Drafting has to start NOW, if we want the legislation to hit the senate floor then.

- a. The push for small scale GNB renovations
- b. Floor Plan access for students (when selecting housing)

Sec Stephens: To know the type of amenities within housing, if the room is close to bathrooms etc. The question is what is the university willing to release to the students – but was actively done a few years ago but stopped.

Sec Stephens: how can we see the university do better with the signage and the renovation and upkeep of these halls could be talked about in the legislation. Why did it take students for these to be found?

Sen. Bakshi - Would this audit ever entail a change to all single-stall gender-neutral bathrooms so we don't really have all these problems. Especially if it singles someone out if they go to the gender-neutral bathroom?

Sec. Stephens - That would be a question about funding, especially for the next DEI secretary. Also, with the halls easing up on like women and men strict separation of the halls and being more lenient (ex: Honors dorm has men and women living together in the same wing)

Sen. Bakshi: Who would be writing the legislation?

Sen. Gay: Its a collaborative effort between INF and DEI – if you go to the meetings and want to help with it you can

Director Gates: Sending out an email specifically to Sen. Gay, Sen. Kelley, & Sen. Hughes because those are the senators who expressed the most interest in those – but people can be cc on the email if you are interested

V. Director of Trans Equity Inclusion Updates

A. Director Gates

Director Gates: Put hard timeline on gender-neutral bathroom bc of legislation. Last meeting of the Senate without cabinet elections is April 5th.

Sen. Bakshi - in the steering committee, they said we won't be having senate on the 20th and the 27th so no clue what would happen with and how we see legislation. Probably you should talk to Speaker Villanueva about that.

Director Gates: My plan was to send an email to the senators drafting legislation to see where we are with that and coordinate. It's really just getting a hard timeline down. The resolution is really just getting faculty and admin to go ahead and start putting that on the maps we have. The action items are actively changing the bathrooms themselves. The 2nd floor of Stoddard and Elliot bathrooms will be degendered for next year. Having inclusive floor plans is a starting point and having a foundation for future ASG to build off of. Trans Day of visibility is coming up!!

B. Director Skoczen

Sen. Ogunnowo: No lesbian flag on the LGBTQ+ flag wall of CSDI and then it was pushed to the far side.

Sen. Gay: Arospec flag was put up for a week but then is gone!

Director Gates: If we want to we can potential do legislation regarding it.

Sen Olabode: With the plaques on Western dorm halls – why wasn't the buildings named after the person but instead Beechwoods was renamed to Young?

Sec Stephens: The hall names are kind of reserved for those who are for funding and endowments. But if this something you want to consider for next year please continue and fight for it.

VI. Round Table Discussion (Initiative ideas)

A. How are symbols important for inclusion?

Western Lobbies, Haygood Way, Nellie Craig Building, Wayne Embry

Sen. Bakshi: more inclusivity and representation in the residence halls. It can help more people become more inclusive but the only problem is that some people may not respect what is put out. Will explore strict disciplinary action for students who violate for this. (conversation for Vika)

Sen. Constandinidis: There has been a lot of targeting of students with saying the f-slur and other slurs. Feels like Residence Hall does not really do a lot in punishment to hinder this.

Sec. Stephens: Someone can go ahead and message someone in Resident Life just to kind of dissect what Resident life does for punishment.

Sen. Constandinidis: It is what makes people feel included, and show their voices are being heard.

Sen. Ogunnowo: Makes people feel welcomed – shows that people will always feel represented. Lets people know they are welcomed and they can share how they feel.

Sec. Stephens: Especially with international students, they are spending \$\$\$ to be here. Just these things show that they matter such as plaques put up in the dorm halls.

Director Gates: Intersectionality is important. Representation in different places where marginalized students are forced to represent one identity over the other. With symbols, we have to constantly look at the intersectionality and who we're honoring.

Sec Stephens: This is something our university has to be improved on. Activism is not just on the street and protesting. – (Sideline - Sen. Dang can you introduce yourself to the committee)

Sen. Dang: Currently on elections and on-campus. Will be working with SEALs how cultural organization led by a non-native english speaker can have a tough time learning how to get funding and move up a tiers. Looking at getting some of the documents in different languages instead of just English

Sec. Stephens: Thank you so much for coming! It shows a lot that you are not on the committee but are still coming to the meetings.

B. NPHC Land Plots, Freedom Summer Expansion inside Armstrong

Sec Stephens: 4 greek councils : IFC, NPHC, Multicultural , Pan-hellenic. How are we including these greek councils (NPHC) and giving them land plots to show their legacy here at Miami University. These will need a lot of student support, and rallying behind it to make it come forth.
